Springboig/Barlanark Thriving Places Steering Group

Note of meeting held on 17 January 2019 in Barlanark Community Centre

1. Minutes of previous meeting

The minutes of the previous meeting on 22 November 2018 were agreed as an accurate record.

2. Jobs and Business Glasgow

Cathy Noble provided the group with an overview of the services delivered by Jobs and Business Glasgow and highlighted the following:

- There were now more opportunities for customers and the priority was to engage with as many partners as possible
- Services were co-locating with partners, mostly in Glasgow Life venues
- There were 15 venues across the North East sector
- JBG was delivering frontline services for employability including supporting Universal Credit
- 5 Customer service assistants were located across 13 hubs delivering a 5 stage programme: engagement, barrier removal, assessment, supporting the journey towards employment and aftercare.
- Bespoke training was available
- 3 additional customer service assistants were being recruited to handle enquiries
- In partnership with Glasgow Kelvin College supporting employability award at the Bridge, Legacy Hub and Springburn Campus
- Services are also provided in some job centre

Cathy agreed to circulate a copy of the pack providing more information to group members.

Eddie asked if the impact of the closure of Easterhouse Job Centre was known. It was noted that JBG works closely with DWP and Jacqui confirmed that Universal Credit had

gone live on 5 December 2018. Over 900 people had switched to the new benefit and most people are receiving their benefit on time. They are also working closely with landlords and direct payments to landlords can be requested. Both DWP and JBG are delivering more flexible, local services using co-location and the impact on local people appeared minimal.

3. Thriving Places Action Plan

The action plan that was previously distributed was discussed and updates provided in relation to

- The CSG survey had not been undertaken yet as CSG were transitioning to the Council. This would be picked up after the transition
- Calway HA survey had received 253 responses (30% response rate). The report would be available to this group once it had been to the Calway Board. Initial findings included 35% of people think the area is better, 12% thought it wasn't any better; 25% want more involvement with 36% not wanting to be involved; 47% felt the area was quieter; 13% raised litter/rubbish as an issue; there were high levels of friendship in the area; 85% felt they belonged to the area. It was noted that other opportunities for engagement will arise in the future but we should also ensure we feedback to the 25% that wanted to be more involved. It was noted that these results only related to Barlanark
- JBG provide a range of activities to help engage people for example stress workshops
- Other Housing Associations can include additional questions in their surveys if asked

4. Community Engagement Sub Group

A report was circulated providing feedback on the engagement activity at the Budhill Winterfest event in December. Consultations had been undertaken by college students as part of the Empowered to Take Action programme. A variety of activities were provided to engage with residents. A total of 50 consultations were completed and respondents were advised that further contact would be made in the New Year. An action plan had been included within the report detailing recommendations how to progress, for example, feedback to respondents, school competition to devise new name/logo, update community profile, clean up events to action what people had asked for and to engage with local people further and a further Winterfest event in December 2019. The sub-group would also look at all the responses received from other consultations that had taken place so far.

CSG would assist with the community clean ups and Barbara would pass on contact details of the relevant officers. She also advised that the generic postcards produced for all 3 Thriving Places in North East could be handed out at events and she would pass copies of these when engagement activity was taking place.

It was suggested that Budhill Square could be used for event space in the summer. The feedback from Winterfest was to hold the event indoors this year due to the cold weather, possibly in Barlanark Community Centre.

It was agreed that future reports should be produced in this format as it provided detail of the work undertaken and recommendations on future actions.

The sub-group agreed to meet again on 22 January at 1.30pm in Barlanark Community Centre.

5. Thriving Places Anchor Organisation Update

Craig advised that the Community Connector post had been advertised with a closing date of 27 January at 11.45pm. The post had been advertised on MyJobScotland, local networks and GCVS. So far, 4 applications had been completed and 31 partially completed. Eddie Andrews would now be on the interviewing panel. The salary costs were slightly higher due to the college pension costs however the costs were still within the available budget. The college was not taking a management fee. The interviews were planned for 12 February. The successful applicant would start following references and PVG check.

The college was also working on the Pathfinder template to include the use of google maps. This would enhance the asset mapping process.

Craig advised his role within the college would be changing to allow him more time to focus on Thriving Places and other community engagement work.

6. 2018/19 Development Budget

A paper was circulated detailing the current position in relation to the 2018/19 development budget. To date £1,096 had been committed leaving a balance of £4,154.

Kirsteen advised that the costs for the hoodies had not been advised and requested that the invoice be submitted as soon as possible. The group advised that no other costs had been committed from the budget.

A template was circulated for future requests for funding to ensure an audit trail of funding and assist with monitoring of expenditure.

Winterfest funding

A paper was tabled at the meeting outlining an overspend in the Winterfest Budget. Funding had been awarded by the East Centre Area Partnership and Platform was seeking an additional £2,000 to meet the overspend. Other issues were also highlighted, for example, the lantern parade did not take place, Santa was early resulting in additional presents having to be purchased, too much activity etc. There also appeared to be lack of co-ordination on the day.

As the costs of the hoodies was not known at this stage, the group could not confirm the level of budget available therefore did not agreed to fund the Winterfest

overspend. In addition, it was agreed that Partnership and Development would meet with Platform to discuss the overspend and the other issues highlighted.

Craig advised that next financial year, the college would hold the development budget. Any funding would not be released without prior approval and would only be released for the activity requested.

7. AOB

Craig requested that the Community Learning and Development Plan and the Digital Glasgow Strategy be discussed at the next meeting.

Ruth also suggested that the Health and Wellbeing Survey results could be discussed at a future meeting.

8. Date of next meeting

The next meeting is on Thursday, 21 March 2018 at 2pm in Barlanark Community Centre.
