1. Welcome and introductions:

Eric Duncan - Introduced and welcomes everyone and thanked all for attending.

2. Thriving Places Update:

Morven - introduced the Thriving Places team and informed the group that stage 1 of the process was complete. The report was the result of interviewing 299 people face-to-face and 150 people online about living in Drumchapel, which in turn produced many issues voiced and recorded from local residents. The report 'Living in Drumchapel' was published. Stage 2 of Thriving Places has now been funded by Aspiring Communities which is the Community Connection Plan for 2019 – 2020. Following up on the report of stage 1 the aim is to support the personal and collective empowerment of the people living in Drumchapel. By responding to the consultation taken by the Thriving Places team which saw that the people of Drumchapel have many barriers that prevents them to progress forward. Thriving places will connect people to the services they need, promote and exercise participatory democracy, help the people of Drumchapel become all that they can be, which will make Drumchapel a happier and thriving community.

Details of the Living in Drumchapel Report and a breakdown of the Community Connecting plan was given to the group.

Ted - provided information on the amount of funding received which has secured the progression of stage 2. Funding was provided from the Scottish Government, the European Social Fund, and GHA. This funding will cover the Community Connecting Plan that Thriving Places have in place and will run from June 2019 to August 2020.

3. Member updates/ Information Sharing.

Update COPE Scotland given by Hilda Campbell

COPE the one to one project of COPE Scotland core funded by GCC IGF covering West Glasgow has moved into new premises at Garscadden House, phone number and email remain the same. Feedback so far people are liking the new space

Given changes in IGF Hilda suggested to all present that a local event is held inviting those currently in receipt of IGF who may apply to the new fund and those thinking

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of applying to the new fund to get together, explore local priorities and find a way to take a collegiate and not competitive approach to this, being open to idea maybe some new ways of working maybe needed. Sharon from 3D thought this would be a good idea as did Eric who suggested exploring ways to make this happen would be helpful

Hilda shared copies of the new Community diary designed by COPE Scotland as an additional resource to compliment the resource booklets they designed enabling people to find out more about what is going on in their community and having a diary to capture important dates of events etc

Hilda shared copies of new contact postcard co designed with the Drumchapel Parents Hub to promote resources which they may find helpful which also support a trauma informed community

Hilda also shared about a community event being held 10th September, connect4life, next planning meeting 2nd July 10.30-12 at the community hub chest heart and stroke shop

Hilda also promoted workshops being run in partnership with the health defence programme chest heart and stroke these are the last Friday of the month 10.15-12.5 and run until Christmas when uptake and impact will be reviewed

Finally, Hilda shared the date for the next daytime disco is the afternoon of 10th September at Drumchapel Community centre and invited those present to please promote this as an opportunity to get out, have fun and meet people. This is being delivered in partnership with the Weekdaywow factor, there is a further one planned for Halloween too.

Peter Divers - Presentation about LOOP. This will be a shared marketing tool and is piloted by G15 Youth Project for 3 months. It is available on any social media platform and is full of information about all groups and organisations that are available to everybody. This is one source which includes information about every available contact and services that anyone is entitled to use. This will make searching for resources more accessible as the user will only use this site to find what they need and click on the appropriate link. All organisations will be added to the admin and are allocated 2 posts per day to the site.

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Tracy Anderson – Holiday programme will be running during the summer break.

Parklife did not receive funding but there is a gigs programme which will involve a worker taking a kit bag to Drumchapel park and doing various activities.

Joyce Bell – D in the Park will be the 20th July. 40 groups will take part and lots of free activities for families to take part in.
