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<p>Blairdardie Primary School</p> <p>Outdoor Learning Through Play</p> <p>PRN 564/13</p>	<p>Funding is requested to enable staff to purchase waterproof clothing for all pupils of Blairdardie Primary School. Blairdardie Parent Council and PTA support the application. Due to the COVID 19 pandemic the Scottish Government has advised that pupils should engage in outdoor learning as much as possible. In addition to this Physical Education lessons are also to be held outdoors. The scientific benefits of outdoor learning are included in the Scottish Government guidelines, stating how this reduces the risk of transmission of COVID 19 as well as providing benefits to children's mental and emotional wellbeing. <p>Men Matter Scotland</p> <p>Men Matter Community Mini Bus</p> <p>PRN: 608/19</p>	<p>Men Matter Scotland based in Drumchapel is a suicide prevention organisation providing peer support network for men. The organisation provides a safe non- judgmental space for men to talk about their problems, engage in positive activities and to take steps to a more hopeful future.</p> <p>Men Matter offer a wide range of activities and emotional support. The organisation has the service of volunteer cognitive behavioural therapists and four full time volunteers who dedicate their time to provide emotional and mental well-being support. This is achieved through 1:1 sessions and by offering a wide variety of activities including, breakfast clubs with healthy eating options and talking sessions, yoga classes, stress reduction classes, weekly outward bound excursions to various locations around Scotland, fitness classes within the internal gym. Transport is an issue for a lot of the Men Matter service users, making it difficult to access the Hub. Access to a mini bus/transport was one of the top priorities with members after consultation about their needs and requirements. This will enable staff to pick up services users and transport them to the Hub and also take them to activities. one of the ways Men Matter tries to improve the mental wellbeing of members is to provide a trip at least once a week to various locations in Scotland to enable members to enjoy the scenery and also provide outward bound activities to increase their self-esteem, mental wellbeing and also provide the opportunity to meet other men in a similar position. The mini bus would also be an additional resource to the local community with the opportunity to hire the bus at a preferential rate or to provide it free for disadvantaged groups.</p> <p>500 of the service users reside in ward 14.</p>
