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Glasgow City - Deaths by suicide

- Sadly in 2020, 104 people died by suicide in Glasgow City.
- Every single death is a tragedy.
- Good progress was made in Glasgow particularly between the years 2013- 2017. (Reduction in deaths by suicide.) But..
- In the past two years numbers have gone back up to treble figures. (Increase in national trends also)
- We must extend our partnership and increase our efforts
